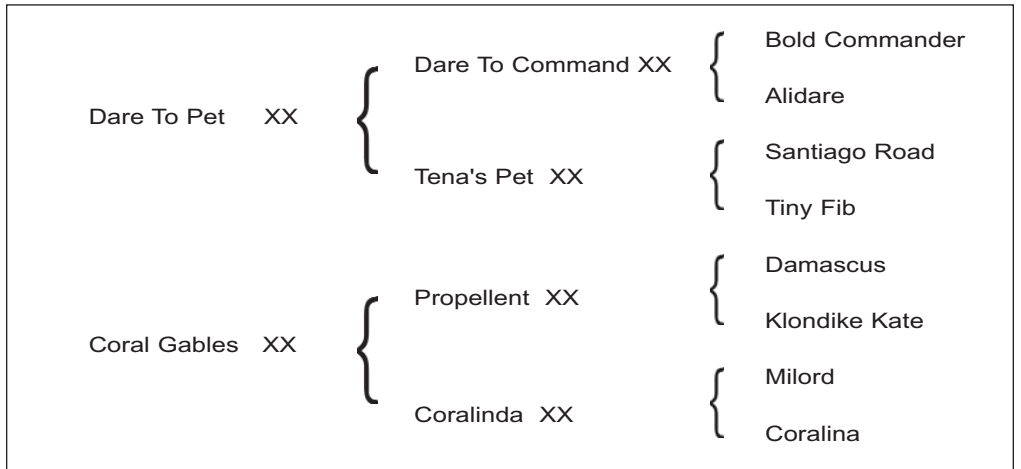

Origin: *Coconut Grove has strong lineage to produce jumpers, proven by the fact that his sister, Satra, was also a member of the Nat'l Show Jumping Team for Colombia.

*Coconut Grove descends from the Bold Ruler / Damascus cross, which produced the legendary Grand Prix Jumper and sire, Napur. Damascus is prolific blood to produce jumpers. The 5th All Time Sire of Steeplechasers is a Damascus son.



Performance Record: *Coconut Grove is the FIRST thoroughbred stallion in history to be granted a breeding license by the American Holsteiner and the American Hanoverian Organizations, under the status of improvement sire. Coconut Grove has 100% approval status - eight U.S. registries - one Canadian registry - 7 European registries. No thoroughbred stallion in the United States has accomplished this feat. In 2005, *Coconut Grove was selected for the Hanoverian Jumper Breeding Program. It is rare to find a thoroughbred stallion with such an impressive Grand Prix Show Jumping career. In addition to winning 3 consecutive National Show Jumping Championships 1997-99, *Coconut Grove was the Best South American Horse (Team 5th) at the Pan American Games in 1999, Champion in the Bolivarianos Games, Res. Champion in the Centro American Games and Champion in several World Cup Qualifiers in So. America. *Coconut Grove was equally successful competing in the U.S., placing 3rd in the prestigious \$100,000 U.S. Open Jumper Championships and 6th in the WEG Challenge Cup both in 2000. *Coconut Grove ranked 3rd in the 1999-2000 AGA Rookie of the Year Standings. He qualified for all major show jumping events: the Olympics in Australia, the World Cup in Sweden, the Am. Invitational and the Am. Grand Prix Association Championships. Often described as "amazing" when referred to in editorial columns, *Coconut Grove has displayed an uncanny ability to jump from difficult distances and clear fences. The stallion is very agile, has abundant scope and his jumping technique is exceptional. He is constantly being sought after by the Germans, Dutch and French. *Coconut Grove is the ONLY world class thoroughbred Grand Prix Jumping stallion standing in the U.S.

Breeding/Progeny Record: Coconut Grove TWO TIMES sired the high scoring foal of the Selle Francais Inspect. tour 2004 & 2006 - Quinze De Upatoi & Santorini (sold to Anne Kursinski). Coconut Grove sired: Coquette - Top 3 Hanoverian Filly out of 30 foals - Hilltop Inspect. 2006, Coconut Royal - Ranked 4th in the Nation - Sport Horse Breeding 2006, undefeated weanling, Champ. 3/under C/G, Res Show Champ. all ages/genders, Best in the NW Award & Show High Point Hanoverian, Cocopelli - PA PHA Year End TB Hunter Breeding Champ. 2005 and Coconino - Hunter Breeding Champ. 2006. Coconut Grove sired 100% premium foals in 2006 - AHHA, RPSI & GOV. Stallion prospects were sold in 2006 from his European foal crop. He sired 2007 inspection site champions; Chase & Cocoa Contada (Han), Class Act (ISR/OLD), Calypso (KWPN/NA) and Cayah Bey & Handyman (2nd & 3rd highest scoring foals of BWP/NA tour). Santorini was Res. Champ. Yearling - Devon 2007. Sons, Coconut Cardo (Hol) and CarinoOHF (RPSI) were approved as stallions in 2007.
