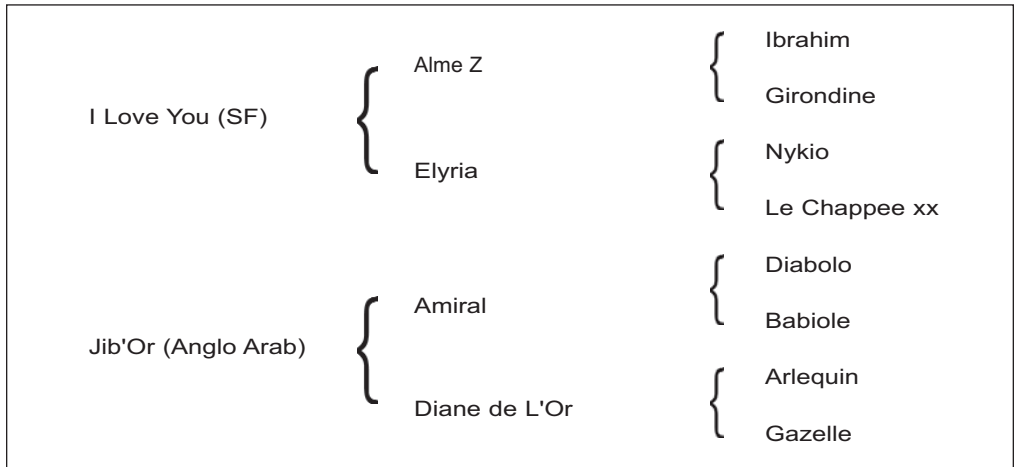

Origin & Breeding/Progeny Record:

Edelweiss de Bonce is by I Love You-ridden by Norman Dello Joio, I Love You was USA Showjumper Horse of the Year in 1983 following his win of the World Cup in Vienna. In 1984, I Love You was second in the World Cup in Goteborg, Sweden. He also won Grand Prix at Washington, Toronto and Calgary before returning to France to stand at stud. He in turn is by the great Selle Francais, Alme Z. I Love You has produced many international showjumpers, including Quentuchy, Qyou de Longvaut, Quality You, Quick Love Fontaine, Querido de Baussy, Barrios de Frely, I Need You, Free Love, and many more. Edelweiss' mother is Jib'Or, a French Anglo Arab. In addition to Edelweiss, she also produced the approved 1990 Anglo Arab stallion, Cool Fontaine who sired the approved 1996 French national stallion, It's Boy. Jib'Or's mother, Diane de l'Or, is by Arlequin, the sire of the great Zeus. Diane produced three approved stallions, who in turn have produced successful eventers and showjumpers. One son, Phosph'Or, himself was a great performer in international competitions with a jumping index of 165 and his son, Fusain de Defey, an approved stallion, accumulated a jumping index of 162. Combined they have over 70 children competing in the showjumper and eventing sports with indexes over 120 points.



Performance Record: Edelweiss de Bonce is a Selle Francais stallion bred in France who qualified as both a 5 and a 6 year old Finalist in Dressage at Fontainebleau. He was further trained to Grand Prix dressage level in Germany by Catherine Haddad, and competed there at S level before coming to the U.S.A. He then competed successfully in California for Cory Walkey under his new rider, Mette Rosencrantz. He has now retired to stand at stud. He was licensed by the Oldenburg Verband in Germany in 2002, and completed his license via his career dressage competition results. Edelweiss is a quiet horse with excellent temperament and work ethic. A lovely mover and a tall, modern type, he makes an excellent choice for producing hunters, eventers and for those heavier dressage mares. His semen has been tested at 85>90% progressive motility.
