Origin: Hexagon's Louisville comes from a long line of influential sires. His sire Burggraaf is widely known as one of the greatest showjumping sires of modern times, producing two international level showjumpers in his first season of breeding just a limited book of mares. At his 100 Day Test, Burggraaf earned a 9 for his character and 8.5 for jumping. His overall jumping index was very high at 152 points. During his career as a breeding stallion, Burggraaf sired over 30 approved sons and numerable Ster and Keur mares. On his damside, Louisville's pedigree offers the thoroughbred influence of Vesins, a KWPN approved breeding stallion who produced the Dutch jumper stallion, Sebastiaan. While in the Netherlands, Sebastiaan showjumped at the 1.60 level at the Indoor Friesland, Zuidlaren, and Amsterdam CSI's. Sebastiaan was imported to the United States in 1986 by Mary Alice Malone of Iron Spring Farm. Under Mary Alice, Sebastiaan proved his versatility in sport as he moved up the levels in dressage. The pair competed through Intermediare I in Palm Beach as well as throughout the East Coast, including Devon.

Performance Record: Hexagon's Louisville began his international dressage career in Schore, Holland at "Stal Hexagon" with trainer Leunus Van Lieren and his son, Laurens. Under Laurens, Louisville attended the 2000 Dutch Young Riders National Championships in Nijmegen and the pair were the 2001 Dutch National Champions at the Z1 Level. Louisville and Leunus van Lieren competed at the Grand Prix level throughout 2002 and 2003 with good results at top CDIs, including BRNO, Rotterdam, Breda, and Berlijn. Louisville and Leunus were named to both the 2003 and 2004 Dutch B Dressage Teams. In 2005, Louisville was imported to the United States by Karin Offield. Together, Karin and Louisville earned Reserve Champion Grand Prix placings at the Ox Ridge Summer Dressage and Zada Enterprises WEF Dressage Classic CDI***. In 2006, Louisville won the prestigious USDF Amateur Grand Prix Horse of the Year Award and the USDF All Breeds (KWPN-NA) Grand Prix Adult Amateur Horse of the Year Award with scores consistently over 65%. He was invited to compete at the 2006 USEF National Grand Prix Freestyle Championships where he finished sixth in the Grand Prix and eight in the

Breeding/Progeny Record: Wonderella, a 2003 NRPS mare by Hexagon's Louisville, competed in the 2008 World Championships for Young Horses in Verden, Germany. Riding for Israel under Raz Nitzani, she earned highlight scores of 8.0 on her trot and 7.5 for canter in the Five Year Old Small Finals. Hexagon's Louisville offers an extraordinary character, good bone, an uphill build, and good elasticity and with marked, natural swing to the breeding equation. Light framed, modern-typed mares are the ideal picks for this stallion!
