Origin: Hexagon's Louisville comes from a long line of influential sires. His sire, Burggraaf, is widely known as one of the

greatest showjumping sires of modern times, producing two international level showjumpers in his first season of breeding just a limited book of mares. Louisville's dam, Wenda, a Keur mare herself, produced several other notable offspring including Keur mare, Kitty W (by Forum), who had IBOP scores of 9 for walk and 8.5 for trot, Keur mare, Maddy W (by Epilot), and the approved AES stallion, Pablo W (by Damiro), a Z-level jumper at 1.30 meters. Wenda's sire, Vesins, a KWPN approved thoroughbred, also sired the notable Dutch jumper stallion, Sebastiaan. Under Mary Alice, Sebastiaan proved his versatility in sport as he moved up the levels in dressage.

Performance Record: This stallion has consistently demonstrated his outstanding character and international quality, both during his years on the Dutch B-Team and more recently under Karin Offield here in the US. Together, they won the 2006 USDF Amateur Grand Prix Horse of the Year in addition to the 2006 USDF All-Breeds (KWPN-NA) Grand Prix Horse of the Year awards.

In 2002, Hexagon's Louisville was third at grand prix at the CDN Kootwijk, The Netherlands. In 2004, under Leunus Van Lieren, Louisville was named to the Dutch B Team along with such notables as Broere Jazz, Idocus and Alabama. Louisville has competed at the top European shows including the CDI Rotterdam, Breda and others. In 2006, Louisville crossed the ocean to compete under new owner, Karin Reid Offield, and quickly won the prestigious USDF Amateur Grand Prix Horse of the Year and the USDF All Breeds (KWPN-NA) Amateur Grand Prix.

Breeding/Progeny Record: Wonderella, a 2003 NRPS Mare, competed in the 2008 World Championships for Young Horses (Verden). Riding for Israel under Raz Nitzani, she earned scores of 8.0 for the trot and 7.5 for the canter in the 5 Year Old Small Finals. In 2009, the 6 year old mare was Reserve Champion in the Dutch Nat'l Championships in Ermelo at Z-2 Level. She was the youngest horse in attendance. Louisville offers extraordinary character, good bone, uphill build, elasticity and natural swing to the breeding combination. He best suits light framed, modern mares.
