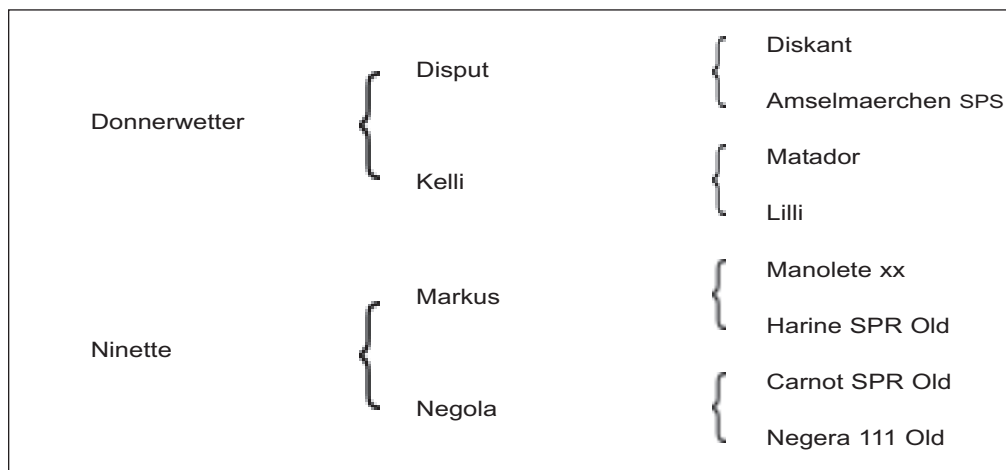

**Origin:** Disco's sire, the black Donnerwetter was himself an accomplished Grand Prix stallion ridden by the famous and brilliant rider/trainer Herbert Rehbein. Very highly ranked in the German Breeding index as well, Donnerwetter sired the Stallion of the Century, Donnerhall. This full brother to Disco Dernier produced 77 licensed stallions, 84 premium mares, and 300 registered sport horses as well is recognized for producing very good riding horses. Donnerwetter, the sire of Donnerhall and Disco Dernier retired in splendid fashion at a lovely farm in Virginia, USA under the watchful eye of Susanne Erickson. Disco Dernier is the last foal of Ninette, the outstanding black Oldenburg mare, mother to Donnerhall and Disco Dernier.

**Performance Record:** Disco spent the early part of his life owned and ridden by a woman who was strictly an amateur rider but was successfully shown and trained by Harold Cornellison of Germany, also coached by the late wizard, Herbert Rehbein. Disco was approved in Oldenburg based on his lifetime performance results. He scored a 69% at the Grand Prix Dressage level at the International Show in Berlin among similar placings at many other prestigious shows. Robert Dover quoted that "he is a really nice horse with promise in international competition". Disco has an excellent attitude both under saddle and in his entire demeanor. He has soft lovely expressive gaits and is very comfortable to sit in both his collected and extended gaits. He is expected to produce horses that are also ideal for an amateur and yet with all the quality for the international competitor.
