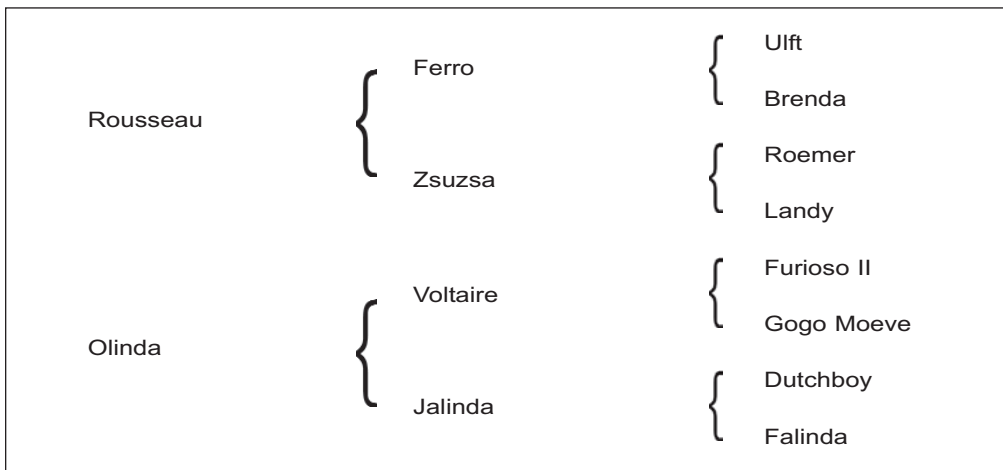

Origin: Wamberto's sire Rousseau was the 2003 Silver Medalist of the World Breeding Championships for Young Horses and is widely thought of as one of the best producing stallions in the world. His KWPN index of 181 indicates Rousseau is the leading producer of dressage horses of the Dutch breed. With two Champion sons out of his first three foal crops, we've only just begun to see the impact Rousseau has to offer. Wamberto's motherline bears equal strength and genetic value. His damsire Voltaire is world renowned, both as a Grand Prix jumper himself and also as sire of many international performers and influential stallions. With over 30 approved sons, it is not surprising to see Voltaire's influence behind such notable names in sport like the dressage star Idocus, the top hunters Popeye K and Nobleman, and the international showjumpers Viktor and Conquest. Wamberto's dam Olinda and his granddam Jalinda have produced international jumpers and licensed sons.

Performance Record: Harmony's Wamberto was the 2006 Champion of the KWPN Stallion Show. His bright expression, outstanding elasticity, and superb elevation brought the crowds to their feet in Den Bosch, applauding this young son of the internationally celebrated stallion Rousseau. Fortunately, prior to this Championship announcement, Scott Hassler, acting as agent, secured Wamberto for Harmony Sporthorses of Kiowa, Colorado and for breeders here in North America. Now, this charming young talent has arrived in the US, claiming more titles as Champion and setting new records. At the 2007 100-Day Stallion Performance Test at Paxton Farm, Wamberto surpassed his peers, winning the test with an impressive margin. His overall performance index was 158.78, where the second placed stallion earned 135.52. With a dressage index of 168.87 and a jumping index of 145.15, Wamberto strongly demonstrated his versatility and outstanding athletic ability. He earned perfect 10 s for his character and canter, and 8 s and 9 s for his walk, trot, and rideability.
